Professional hairdressers have an important role in safeguarding their own health and that of the salor clients and other visitors.</li> <li>Members of the public attending the salon need to know that they are in safe hands so it is of utmost importance that persons providing services are competent.</li> <li>Therefore, this module is one of the first to be taught during the course.</li> <li>This unit is about being able to demonstrate the ability to maintain health safety and security practices in the salon and follow the necessary emergency procedures.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
